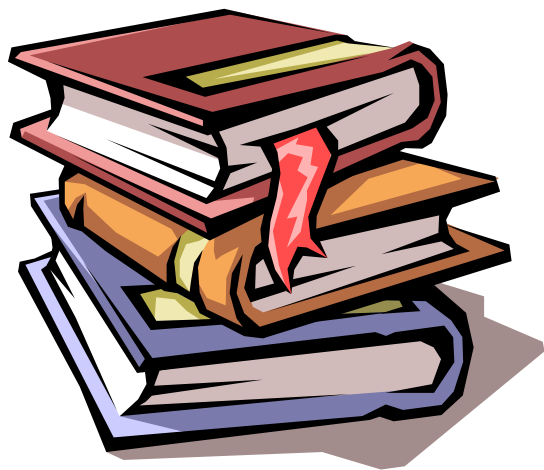

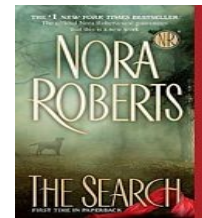

The Search by Nora Roberts

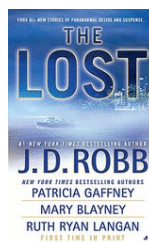

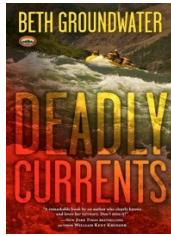

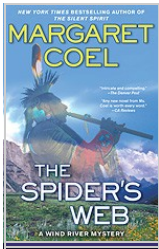
Deadly Currents

by Margaret Coel

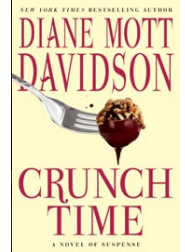

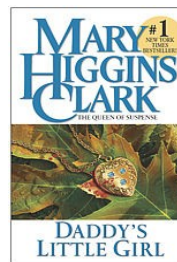
Crunch time
