

Rubendall, Simmons Tie for Medalist Honors In NCAA Golf; Match Play Begins Today

A record-shattering 68 Tuesday by Roger Rubendall, a senior from Wisconsin, pulled him into a tie with first round leader Warren Simmons of Syracuse University for medalist honors in the 60th Annual NCAA Golf Championships. Roger toured the rugged Broadmoor Golf Course in great style and the 68 was six strokes under his opening round of 74 fired on Monday. His total of 142 was the same as turned in by 19-year-old Simmons, a sophomore, playing in his first NCAA meet.

Simmons tacked on a one over par 73 to his first round 69 and blamed a couple of stray shots in the lake for his over par score. The likeable youngster from Canandigua, N. Y., was one of the early players in and sat out through most of the day looking for someone to catch him.

The top 64 players will now go into match play for the individual crown. The cut off point was at the 156 mark and this will bring about a few playoffs early this morning for the final spots in the match play competition. Play will begin today at 9 a. m.

The golfers from the University of Houston edged out Stanford for the team title, 602-603. Jimmy Hiskey turned in a 73 to clinch the title for Houston, North Texas State was third with 606, then came Florida State and Fresno State with 607 and Arizona State with 609.

BOBBY SHAVE, son of a Cleveland pro, had the third place spot all to himself with a total of 146. The Florida State sophomore turned in a brilliant

one under par 71 to go with his opening card of 75.

James Bernard of Arizona State and Frank Wharton of Houston were knotted in the fourth spot with totals of 147s. Both turned in 73s to go with Monday's two over par 74s. Bernard, however, will not be able to stick around for the match play because he will return home for a summer job.

Four more players totaled 148. They were Ward Wettlaufer, Hamilton, Harold Sexton, North Texas State; Tom Watrous, Detroit; and Harry Shoemaker, Illinois.

Favored Rex Baxter, Jr., and Joe Campbell were far back but qualified, Baxter from Houston put together 74-75 for 149 while

Campbell was at the 152 mark with 75-77.

The 11 players tied at 156 will play off for six places this morning.
