

IVYWILD GETS FIRE APPARATUS

**ALDERMAN COUGHLIN MAKES
GIFT, AND A VOLUNTEER
HOSE COMPANY WILL BE
FORMED.**

Ivywild now has a real fire-fighting apparatus.

It consists of 1,000 feet of one and one-half inch hose, together with a real carriage for winding and transporting it. The carriage is now manned by an improvised fire brigade but this will soon be superseded by a regularly formed volunteer company.

The new apparatus is the gift of Alderman John J. Coughlin, of Chicago. Alderman Coughlin has been an extensive investor in Ivywild property, and his present action is for the purpose of advancing the interests of that section.

Ivywild has a gravity pressure of about 40 pounds which is thought to be sufficient for all practical purposes. This is about two-thirds of the pressure of the Colorado Springs system at Tejon street and Pike's Peak avenue, and is more than at some of the outlying districts of the city.
